FIRST IMPRESSIONS

Examine drawings and listen to journal entries from European explorers to draw conclusions about what they thought of Native Americans.

CHANGING SEASONS

Discover how Native Americans used seasonal cues from the environment to help them survive.

EVERYDAY TOOLS

Investigate Native American artifacts and identify how various tools were made and used.

TRADED GOODS

Participate in a matching game to find out how Indians of this area got the stone they needed for making tools.

TOYS & GAMES

What did Native American children do for fun? Play a game of “bowl catch” and find out!

FROM PAST TO PRESENT

Find out why there is so little historic evidence of Native Americans in our region. Discover who and where Native Americans are today.
