

I Spy...Visual Scavenger Hunt

Explore sight with a fun game of I spy. This requires no additional materials, just creativity with your surroundings!

Instructions:

- You can play I Spy with two or more people.
- To begin, one person spies something and keeps it a secret. The item must be something that all the other players can see, and preferably something that will stay in sight for the time it takes to complete a round. For example, a motorcycle that whizzes by and disappears around a bend is not an ideal item to "spy."
- The "It" player recites the line "I spy with my little eye, something that..." and ends with a descriptive clue, such as "...is red" or "...has three handles."
- The other players then take turns asking one question each. "Is it on a shelf?" "Is it round?" "Does it have wheels?"
- The player who is "It" can only respond with "yes" or "no."
- If a player thinks they know what the mystery item is, they can use the question to guess directly: "Is it that barn?" "Is it that pickup truck?" "Is it their sunglasses?"
- When somebody guesses correctly, then they become "It" player. The game moves forward with the new "It" player spying a different item and beginning by reciting "I spy with my little eye, something that..."

If your child is learning a new concept, this may be a good way to reinforce the information or familiarize them with the concept more. For example, if your child is learning a new color, you could make the rules to where players are only allowed to "spy" something that is green. Instead of saying "I spy something green", they could say "I spy something with leaves" or "I spy something on a plate"
